#### **District Profile**

Humla District is a part of Province No. 6, is one of the seventy-five districts of Nepal. The district, with Simikot as its district headquarters, covers an area of 5,655 km² and has population of 50,858 as per the census of 2011.[1] The Northern part of Humla District is inhabited by Buddhists, originating from Tibet, whereas the South is mostly inhabited by Hindus.

#### **Program**

On November 25, 2017, HURON team conducted training at Simijot of Humla district. During the inaugural ceremony, the guests were honourable Humla Program Coordinator and CDO Kumar Bahadur Khadka Kumari. The opening ceremony began at 9 am in the morning.

District level training was started after the opening ceremony. Training attendees were Nepal District officers, Village development committee members, teachers, and students, representatives from political parties, media persons, NGOs and civil society members, armies, police personnel, armed police force and Ward President. There were 55 attendees during the inaugural ceremony.

Training session began at around right after the opening ceremony. There were total 47 participants where HURON members, Media Personnel, Security personnel (Nepal police and Armed Police Force), students, teachers and Ward members were attended. Out of 47 participants 13 were female and 34 were male.

The training templates which were distributed covered Fundamental Rights of Nepal, Civil Rights, Good Governance, Gentlemen's Agreement, International laws and Regulations and Treaties, Federalism, Crisis Management and Sustainable Development Goals.
